## ANOTHER LETTER FROM A CENTRAL OFFICE VOLUNTEER:

I have been sober through the grace of God and the help of Alcoholics Anonymous since May 25, 2015. I found sobriety at the age of 49 having believed I would die soon and now, almost 7 years later, I believe I will have a long, long life, one day at a time.

One of the most powerful prayers I have come across is the Third Step prayer. The part where I ask God to relieve me of the bondage of self was and is the part I say often. At six or seven months sober I wanted to drink. I had wanted to drink most days of those six or seven months. I recall continuing my prayers and asking God to help me - help me stay sober. I don't want to drink anymore.

In late December 2015, a woman I met soon after I got sober came across my path at the old Serenity Club on a cold snowy night. She had become homeless and she was still sober. God had answered my prayers then too. He sent me someone that needed my help. I was able to help that woman get housing. We also helped each other grow in sobriety for the next few months. I started to get relief from the bondage of self from that experience.

Soon after, I started to spend more time after meetings letting people get to know me and getting to know people. I took on a Central Office hotline service position on Wednesday nights. I still have that hotline position and it is an important part of my routine. I served as a General Service Representative (GSR) for the old Saturday, Fourth Dimension meeting in 2017 and 2018. I have helped take meetings to the Harvest Farm and other treatment facilities. And, it has been a pleasure to sponsor others since 2016.

I was recently asked to serve as the alternate District Committee Member (DCM) for the Larimer County, Colorado District 21 in late 2021. In February 2022 one of the Co-District Committee Members had a life change and now I have stepped into the Co-District Committee Member role for District 21.

I believe in Alcoholics Anonymous and I want it to be around for my nieces and nephews and all the younger folks that will follow me. I am able to be of service to the organization and the fellowship. I also believe in rotation and see that I can encourage and support others to step into service at the organizational level. I love sponsoring and spending time one on one with other alcoholics and I want the means for alcoholics in the future to make connections as I did back in 2015.

With gratitude and love, I take my responsibility to assure Alcoholics Anonymous remains for future alcoholics to find recovery.

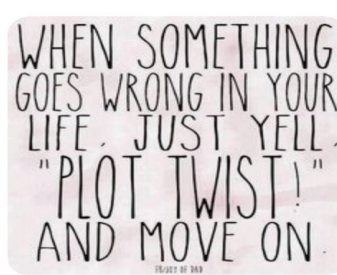

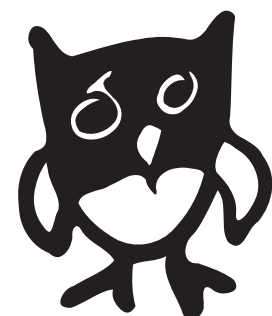
Six months of sobriety required. Answer phones, give out information, speak with alcoholics and/or families/ friends/businesses, etc.
