A letter from the Bridging the Gap committee Chair of District 21:

Hello my fellow members of Alcoholics Anonymous and Trusted Servants. I'm excited to share my experience, strength, and hope with you about the service work I do in our community and how it has helped me stay sober.

My first interactions with service was with my home group — making coffee, bringing cake, and helping set up. After about a year of sobriety I joined the Treatment and Accessibility Committee for District 21, representing my home group as a GSR. I really enjoyed, and still continue to, taking meetings into treatment centers and carrying the message that AA works and you never have to drink again if you don't want to. I was quite fearful at first taking on a 2 year commitment. It sounded so long at 3 years of sobriety. AA has taught me that I can do anything that anyone else can do and not to make decisions out of fear. For 2019-2020 I became the District 21 Treatment and Accessibility Chair. I learned a lot about how AA works and the upside down triangle. I learned what AA does and what AA does not do. Together, the service work we all do, is part of the whole. We ALL have an important role!

Currently, I am the District 21 Bridging the Gap (BTG) Committee Chair and Coordinator through the end of 2022. Bridging the Gap is a temporary contact program that is designed to help the Alcoholic in a treatment program or in-patient hospital make the transition to Alcoholics Anonymous meetings. The committee's purpose is to provide facilities in the district with presentations and information on how to contact Bridging the Gap. I get to oversee these activities and maintain client and volunteer information. I ensure BTG volunteers are informed about the process for contacting the person requesting the Bridge and I follow up to ascertain the success of the Bridge. I work closely with the Treatment and Accessibility Committee. I speak at non-AA meetings by visiting facilities to inform staff and clients about the BTG program, how it works and why it is important.

12 step work or carrying the message to other alcoholics can take many different forms: sponsorship, sharing experience, strength and hope in meetings, bringing a meeting to someone or somewhere, doing presentations/speaking at non AA meetings and more. I chose to take on another 2-year commitment after rotating out of the Treatment and Accessibility Chair position because I knew that doing service work would keep me sober for another 2 years. I have 6 months left on my 2-year rotation and have been actively of service at the district level for 3 ½ years, one day at a time. I have learned so much through this opportunity to grow and connect. I have meet some really wonderful people! I have not done things perfectly, and there are always a million reasons not to do something, but I am so very grateful I did. You do not have to have long term sobriety to take a committee chair position or do service work. Service work is about quality, not quantity — you can just do what you can. Remember convenience is not a principle of AA, but service is. The hard things will set you free! I have a home group, a sponsor, and I'm willing to sponsor other women when the chance presents itself. I am grateful for you all and appreciate all you do!

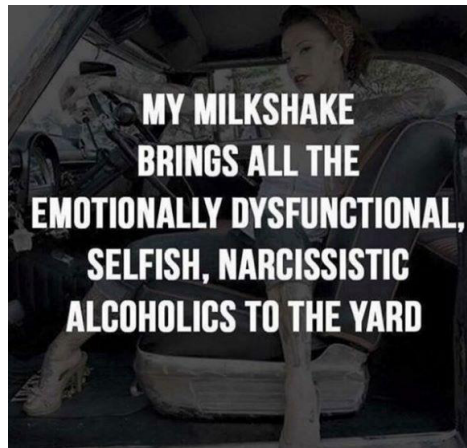

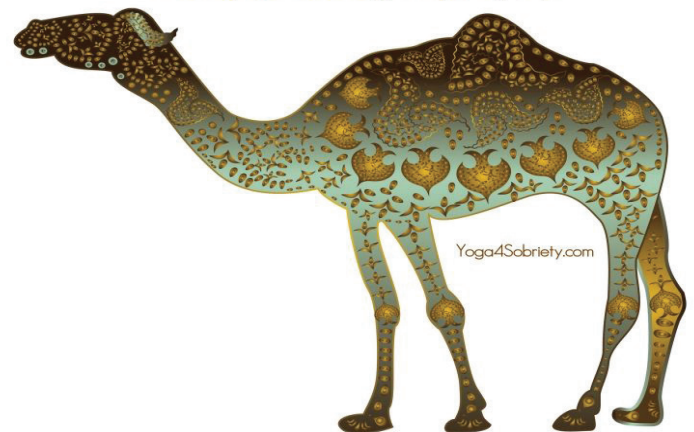

2025 International Convention, Alcoholics Anonymous

**Frequently Asked Questions About the
2025 International Convention & Travel to Canada**

1. *When and where will the 2025 International Convention take place?*

The 90th anniversary of Alcoholics Anonymous will be celebrated at the 2025 International Convention in Vancouver, BC, Canada, July 3 – 6, 2025.

2. *What is the theme of the 2025 International Convention?*

The theme of the 2025 International Convention is "90 Years – Language of the Heart."

3. *Have A.A. International Conventions been held in Canada before?*

Yes. There have been International Conventions in Toronto (1965), Montreal (1985), and Toronto (2005). As you may know, the Responsibility Statement was adopted at the 1965 International Convention in Toronto.

4. *Are there any restrictions or regulations affecting travel to Canada in 2025?*

Yes. The U.S. and Canada each have restrictions and regulations that apply to citizens and visitors who travel from one country to the other. Border crossing into Canada has significantly changed, particularly in the last two years. (Access links below question #6 for more information.)

5. *Who will have to process forms and applications to gain admission to Canada?*

It is suggested that those who believe they have some past legal incident, such as a DUI or felony that could inhibit their attendance at the 2025 International Convention, seek assistance/information by accessing the Government of Canada link noted below.

6. *What Canadian travel information is currently available?*

The International Convention assignment at G.S.O. is not yet up-and-running. However, below is a resource to aid members in making plans to attend the 2025 International Convention (most questions can be answered by connecting to the links below). Also, a good travel book on Canada will provide valuable information on needed documents and border crossing requirements, as well as vacation tips.

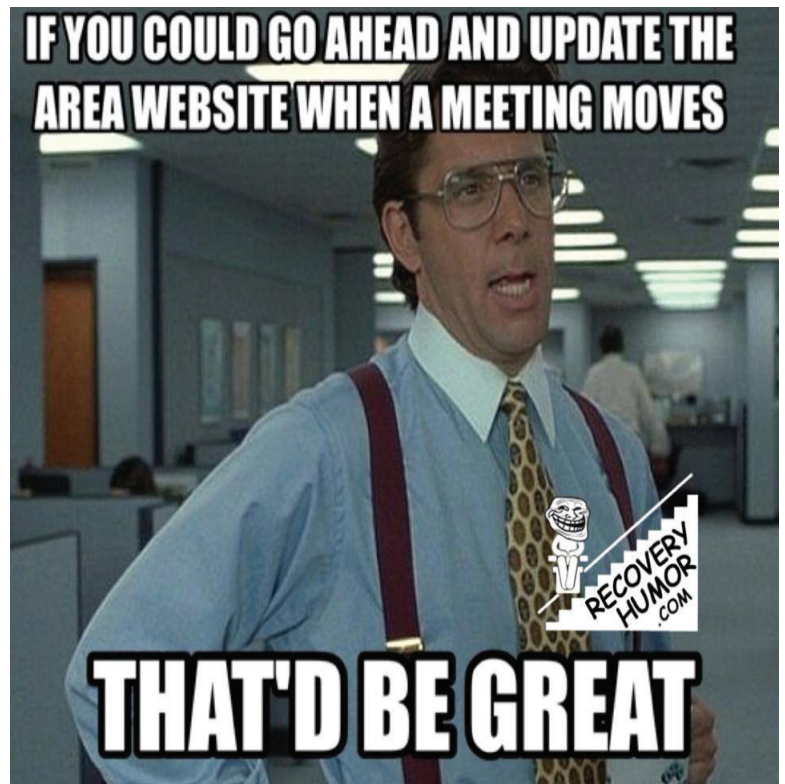
