A letter from longtime & current Central Office volunteer:

Greetings to All:

The early intergroup meetings were held in several locations; the one I remember was the living room at 633 Remington St, as my memory fades, but I believe we met somewhere on South College Ave too.

Our meeting groups at that time came to share and buy literature from a rolling cart/suitcase to take back to the groups. We had an answering service for 12 step calls and used “Kinkos” for printing our meeting schedules and a monthly newsletter.

The first A.A. Intergroup was “F.I.G.”, thus the name “Fort Collins InterGroup.” The newsletter reflected that name and it was called “F.I.G. LEAF”--somewhat appropriate, let’s laugh about that. I do recall years later we changed the name of the newsletter to avoid a copyright infringement on a local business with a similar name.

As time went on “we” decided to have a “AA Central Office” the idea was born and some how it all began. We had several office managers, some were paid not a lot and some worked for a “stipend” to cover minimum wages. Sometimes we weren’t sure how the rent was going to be paid. We have continued with the support of our A.A. Groups and Faithful Fivers, along with several fundraising events to support the Central Office and carry the A.A. message to the still suffering alcoholic.

It was Fred T. who came up with the idea for the name of the “Northern Colorado Central Office”--at the time I did not agree with his vision but the group conscience won out. Thank God, we have a Higher Power and are able to put principles before personalities.

I would like to thank our previous office managers, many have passed on and much gratitude to the others who have served our fellowship along with the Intergroup Service structure Intergroup Representatives, Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Secretary, Special Events and above all the volunteers at the office and the others who answer our 12 Step Calls.

Some of the office managers were Trudy G./H., Carole A., Karl K., Ray B., Ralph S., Marlene S., Nina M., and our current office manager Beth S. To these people we owe a debt of gratitude for their contribution to the office we have today.

We had a City Wide Birthday Night; it might have been long, but we all had a great time celebrating sobriety together and it was at Vineyard Church on Riverside.

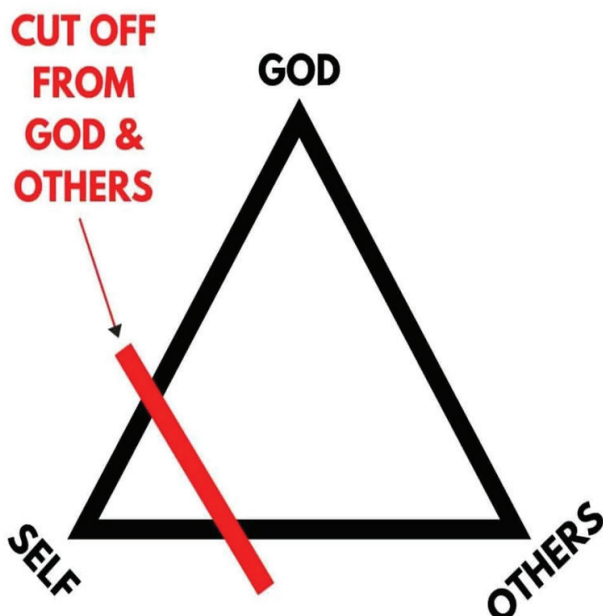

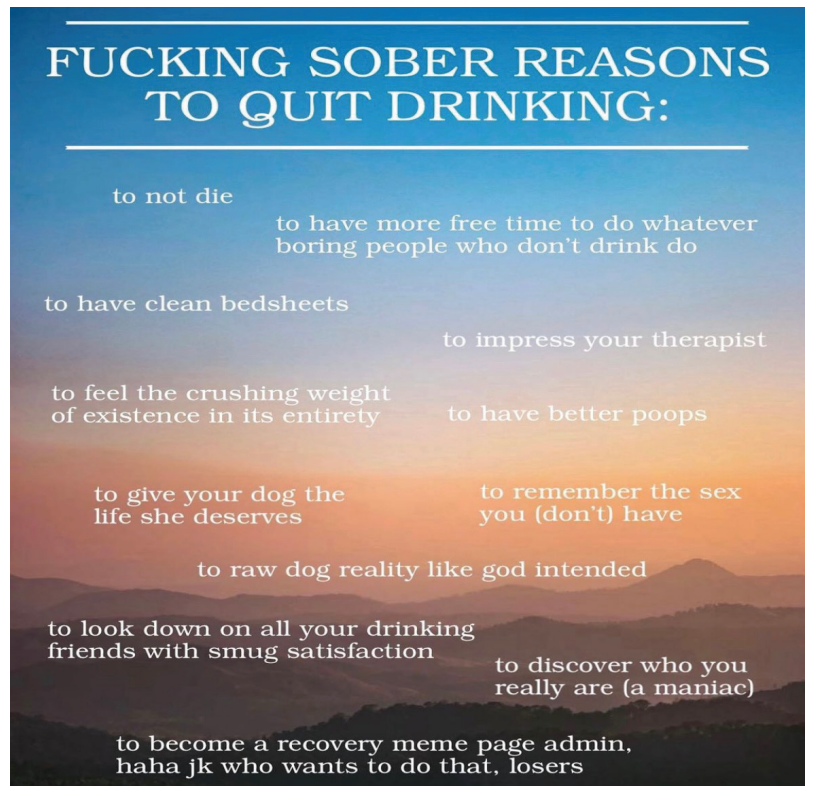

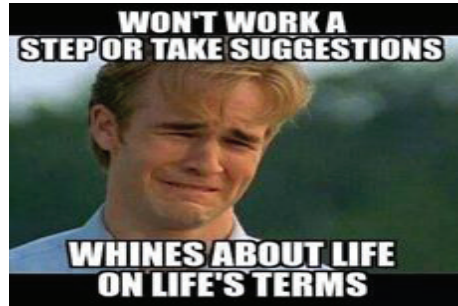
